

<p><b>MULTICULTURALISM</b></p> <p>belief that nationhood includes ethnic groups keeping their cultures</p>	<p><b>NEW AUSTRALIAN</b></p> <p>popular term for an immigrant of non-English speaking background</p>
<p><b>REFUGEE</b></p> <p>person granted refuge in a country after fleeing political, ethnic or religious persecution</p>	<p><b>5.9 MILLION</b></p> <p>the number of people who have migrated to Australia since 1945</p>
<p><b>POPULATE OR PERISH</b></p> <p>the fear that Australia's small population would not allow adequate defence against attack</p>	<p><b>ARTHUR CALWELL</b></p> <p>first Australian Minister for Immigration</p>
<p><b>SNOWY MOUNTAIN SCHEME</b></p> <p>hydro-electric scheme developed to help expand our heavy industry</p>	<p><b>ASSISTED PASSAGE</b></p> <p>a migration scheme that allowed people to come to Australia cheaply</p>
<p><b>DISPLACED PERSONS</b></p> <p>people who were forced to leave their homeland during war and because of the devastation of war</p>	<p><b>1945</b></p> <p>Department of Immigration established in Australia</p>

<p><b>BOAT PEOPLE</b>  refugees that arrived  in Australia via boat,  usually from Vietnam  and South-East Asia</p>	<p><b>TEMPORARY MIGRANT</b>  workers who come to  Australia to work or  study and then return  to their own country</p>
<p><b>BENEFITS</b>  expansion in business  and economy, religious  and cultural diversity</p>	<p><b>WHITE AUSTRALIA POLICY</b>  a belief that no Asians  or blacks should be  allowed into Australia</p>
<p><b>ASYLUM SEEKER</b>  Person who seeks refuge in  a country after fleeing  political, ethnic or  religious persecution or  intolerable economic  hardship</p>	<p><b>ASSIMILATION</b>  Policy whereby migrants  had to assume the  cultural traditions and  language of their new  country</p>
<p>1972  Australian withdrawal  from Vietnam</p>	<p>1976  Year boat people  started arriving in  Australia</p>
<p>1996  Year of many  immigration reforms</p>	<p>7.5 MILLION  Population of Australia  post WWII</p>

<p><b>BRITAIN</b></p> <p>Home country of the largest group of post WWII migrants to Australia</p>	<p><b>COMMUNISM</b></p> <p>Form of government that believes the people should control the means of production</p>
<p><b>INTEGRATION</b></p> <p>Policy whereby migrants could retain their cultural traditions in their new land</p>	<p><b>IRO</b></p> <p>International Refugee Organisation</p>
<p><b>NEW ZEALAND</b></p> <p>People from here can freely enter and work in Australia without Visas or work permits</p>	<p><b>ONE NATION</b></p> <p>Political party opposed to immigration</p>
<p><b>TOLERANCE</b></p> <p>Acceptance of differences</p>	<p><b>VIETNAM</b></p> <p>Origin of many boat people</p>
